Dear Pfizer Medical Plan Participant and Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey Member:

As you may have heard through media coverage, Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield (Anthem) announced that its IT systems were accessed through a cyber attack, and the personal information of as many as 80 million current and former Anthem customers and employees was compromised. Recently, Anthem provided information to Pfizer that some colleagues and retirees have been impacted by the cyber attack. **If your personal information is impacted you will receive written notification from Anthem by U.S. mail.**

Although Pfizer does not directly contract with Anthem, Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey (Pfizer's Blue Cross Blue Shield administrator) and Anthem share claims data as they are both members of the Blue Cross Blue Shield Association (BCBS) of health plans. Consequently, Pfizer colleagues who used a doctor or hospital during the past 10 years in one of the states\* where Anthem does business could be impacted by the cyber attack.

**If You Have Used a BCBS Provider in an Affected State**

Anthem has made free credit monitoring available to anyone who used Blue Cross Blue Shield in the affected states, including Pfizer plan participants who currently use or previously used Horizon as their claims administrator. **If you have been contacted by Anthem (or if you have not been contacted by Anthem but feel concerned about the security of your personal information), we encourage you to register for this credit monitoring service for yourself and your family members.** Details about the credit monitoring service are available at [AnthemFacts.com](http://AnthemFacts.com). Pfizer also contracts with United Healthcare for claims administration, but United Healthcare was not affected by this data breach. Pfizer remains committed to protecting the information of our health plan participants, and contracting with companies who share that commitment.
